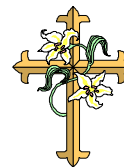

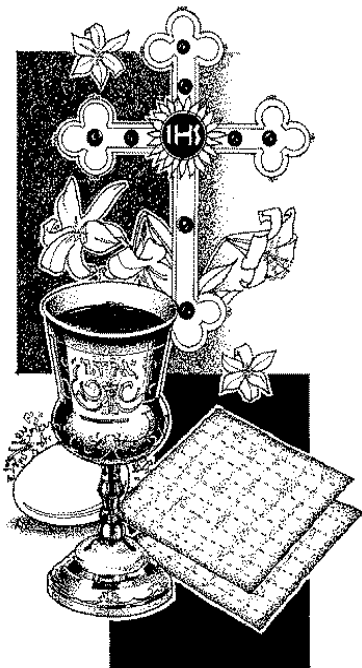

### Q: How does the game work?

What matters is the number of points they scores. You either want your teams to score a lot of points - or - you want your team to score a low number of points.

### Program description

**Number of Teams 4** Each week you have 4 unique teams. The total combined score of these 4 teams determines if you are a winner. If your 4 teams score the most or least combined points, then you are a winner.

**Number of Weeks 10** Your ticket is valid for 10 weeks. Every week, for 10 weeks, you have a chance to be a winner!

**Start Date Oct 31st, 2004** Your ticket will be activate starting on Oct 31st, 2004 .

**End Date Jan 2nd, 2005** The last weekend that your ticket is valid is Jan 2nd, 2005 .

### Q: Does it matter if a team wins or loses?

**A:** No it does not matter if a team wins or loses. What counts is the total number of points scored by your 4 teams each week. Tickets that have high scoring teams have a better chance than tickets that have average scoring teams. Conversely, tickets with teams that score very low have a good chance at winning the lowest score prizes.

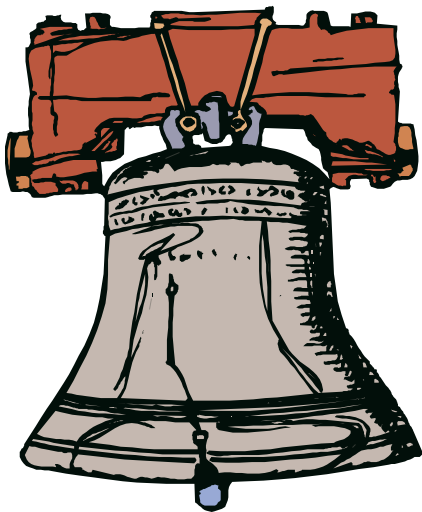
