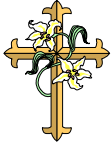

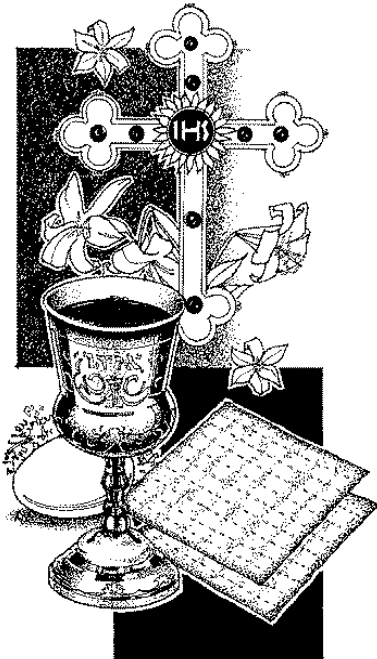

### **FEBRUARY: Beneficiaries...Who Do You Love?**

It will soon be Valentine's Day. Do you know who the beneficiary is on your life insurance policy? It would be a wise idea to find out – and update your beneficiary if necessary. As your K of C agent, I can help you do that. Why is this important? A life insurance policy protects the financial status of another person – or people - in the event of your death. Through a beneficiary designation, you determine just who that should be. When you purchase a K of C insurance policy, you must select a primary beneficiary - at a minimum. You don't have to name a contingent beneficiary – also known as a “secondary beneficiary.” However, it's always a wise move because you might outlive your primary beneficiary. A contingent beneficiary (also known as a “secondary” beneficiary) is the person designated to receive life insurance policy proceeds if the primary beneficiary dies. You should be as specific as possible in wording your beneficiary designation. By naming your wife, daughter, son, etc., as beneficiary, you make sure that the life insurance proceeds will be available in a timely manner to them. Your life situation will undoubtedly change over time. Plan to update your declared beneficiaries periodically. Otherwise, the K of C will have no way of knowing what your intentions are at each stage of your life. Changing your beneficiary is fairly simple. You just need to fill out a change of beneficiary form (#113A) for each policy you want to change. I can provide you with these forms – and I will help you to fill them out. I can also help you with beneficiary designations for any life insurance policy you hold – regardless of the company that issued it. Give me a call. I'm at your service.

*+Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above Jesus. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. "Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, pick up your mat and walk.'"*

**Mark 2: 1-12**



A story you may have heard before tells of two buddies who were hiking in the woods and one is bitten by a rattlesnake.

"I'll go into town for a doctor," the other hiker says. He runs some distance to a small town nearby and finds the only doctor there delivering a baby.

"Look, I can't leave," the doctor says. "But here's what to do. Take a knife, cut a little x where the bite is, suck out the poison and spit it out on the ground."

The guy runs back to his friend, who is in agony.

"What did the doctor say," the victim cries.

His friend has tears in his eyes as he responds, "The doctor says you're going to die."

*How's that for friendship? Certainly, quite unlike Jesus' response about extraordinary friendship. Jesus could not have healed the paralytic if the man's friends had not been willing roofers. Friendship love was the force that moved them to break through the crowd, carry their friend to the roof, break open the roof and carefully lower him down. The hearts of the roofers too are broken open by their act of love. Their attention is centered on the plight of their friend and their hope for a better life for him. In that centering they find the love and truth and compassion that define discipleship with Jesus.*

*These roofers do not get stuck in self-centeredness. They seek not riches, honor and power. Their "Roofer Friendship" is centered on what Antoine de Saint-Exupery defines as "Real Love.": "Real Love is where nothing is expected in return." May our hearts be filled with "Roofer Friendship"*

The three traditional forms of penance, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, "express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1434). 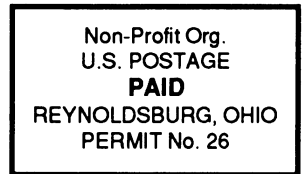
