Our council provided over \$2,600 to support vocations during this fraternal year and we came in second in the state. GREAT work gentleman.

Special thanks go to **Lee Brock** for his untiring efforts at the State Convention. This is exhausting work and he put in many hours helping out.

The Council officers for the upcoming year have been elected, and will be installed at a special Mass on Tuesday, July 1st. Please join us for this special occasion. Light snacks and desserts at the reception following.

Please start thinking about how you can support the Tomato Festival in September – with setup, parking, cleanup, or Fried Green Tomato support. We'll need many hands to make this manageable, and continue to work with Marian Council to share the workload.

From the Chaplain

June 2008



Yesterday afternoon I decided I needed to do something besides sit in my chair and watch TV or surf on my computer. I needed to **do** something. So I told Marge I was going for a walk. I changed my clothes and got in the car. Yes, in the car. I went over to Blacklick Metro Park, got out, and began to walk. Two hours later I re-emerged from the park. I had forgotten how wonderfully refreshing it is to spend time with God amongst God's creation. I had forgotten how peaceful your soul could be when you sit quietly in the midst of the forest. I had forgotten the words, "Be still and know that I am God." Have you noticed the irony? I went to do something and there I was sitting. But I did do something. I spent time with God. I walked. I prayed. I took pictures. One picture I took was of the path ahead of me. It stretched out for what seemed to be a long way. But it wasn't really all that long. Like life, I thought. It seems to go on forever, but it is oh so short. I took a picture of fungus growing on a tree. This was an old tree that had died and fallen. But it provided the sustenance for new life. The imprint we leave behind us can nourish the new life around us just as this tree was doing. I took a picture of a tree that could no longer stand against the wind and had finally crashed to the ground, its roots showing at its base. Like the scattered seeds, I thought, no deep roots. How deep are our roots in the faith we claim. I took a picture of a tree that had begun growing in an arc and then it finally turned and grew straight up. What determination to find the light! Are we that determined to seek out our Light?? I took a picture of some flowers growing right next to a patch of poison ivy. A reminder to all of us that something that can hurt us may be right next to something desirable that draws us out. I took a picture of a tree trunk that had been carved all over. Dates, initials, hearts, names. It reminded me that everyone leaves an imprint on us and it is these imprints that make us who we are. I took another picture of poison ivy, this time climbing up a tree trunk. I thought, how easy it is for hurtful things to overwhelm us. We need each other to keep evil at bay and to keep us from being consumed. It was quite the lesson for a simple 2 hours in the park. But maybe you should go and look for yourself. Go and sit. Be still. Know that God is with you. Enjoy creation. Clear your mind from the everyday noise and business. Let the Spirit touch your soul.

I will write another column next month but by the time you read that one, I will be in or just out of the hospital. I am going in on June 23rd for surgery to correct a neurological problem that has been causing me a lot of facial pain. Please keep me in your prayers.
