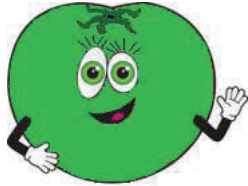




K of C Women's Club Happenings

K of C Insurance Update



“I already have insurance at work.”

The Squires is an international fraternity of approximately 25,000 Catholic young men, ages 10 to 18, in over 1,400 circles worldwide. The Squires emblem includes a Maltese cross upon which are the letters "P" (physical fitness); "I" (intellectual development); S (spiritual growth and the practice of our faith); and "C" (citizenship and civic life). The large letters "C" and "S" intertwined with the cross respectively represent Christ and Squires. The "K" centered on the cross symbolizes the Knights of Columbus. *Esto Dignus*, the Squires' motto encircling the emblem, is Latin for "Be Worthy."

The Order wide goal is for "A Circle in Every Council." The importance of a Squires circle should not be underestimated. A circle helps mold young Catholic men into the strong leaders of tomorrow, while preparing these Squires for their future as active, contributing members of the Knights of Columbus. All you need is at least 10 Catholic young men, between the ages of 10 and 18, and a few of their fathers and/or other Knights to be their counselors.

On August 3, 2010, Fr. Snoke will attend our social meeting and give us some information on forming a Squires Circle. He is an entertaining speaker and will have lots to share with us. If you have a son between the ages of 10 and 18, or an interest in helping out a Squires Circle, please plan on attending.

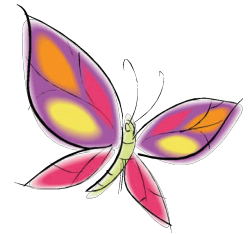
