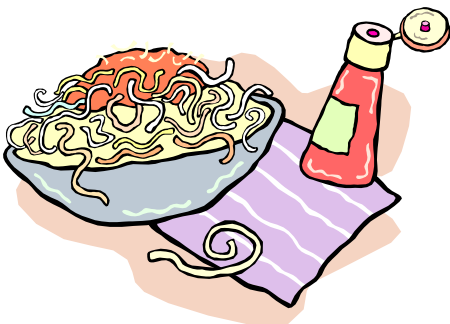
Memorial Mass & Breakfast
