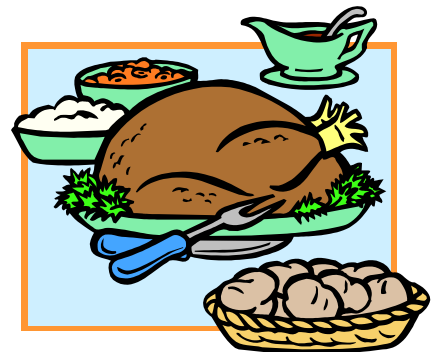

Dear Columbus Diocese Knights:

Recently, Bishop Campbell formed a committee to work for his new initiative for the diocese to raise funds for the prevention and cure of cancer. I was asked to serve on this committee. Our charter was to get diocesan involvement in attempting to raise funds to offset what we may be losing in grants from the Komen Foundation. The DCCW office was asked to chair the effort.

After four months of effort we have established “Catholics for Cancer Prevention and Cure”. Our mission states:

The mission of Catholics for Cancer Prevention and Cure is to provide fundraising opportunities to benefit cancer screening and prevention programs as well as morally acceptable clinical research for the prevention and cure of cancer.

We have decided to partner with the Spielman Foundation for some fund raising activities because their ideals meet our Catholic morals. We will additionally be recommending direct projects for CCPC in the future and will be asking all Knights in the diocese to help.

Our first event is the Step Up For Stephanie 5K run – 2 Mile walk on Sunday, October 28, at Ohio Stadium. All Proceeds go to Breast Cancer Research. Entry fee is \$15 only. NEW BENEFIT PLAN

As of August 1, 2012, the Knights of Columbus released a new benefit for their members and families to consider when they discuss life insurance with their agent. It is called-Graded Premium Whole Life Plan.

It is a modified whole life plan that has premiums that are paid until age 100 at which the plan is guaranteed paid-up. The Graded Premium Whole Life Plan is guaranteed to provide a level death benefit for all of life.

The Graded Premium Whole Life Plan is designed to have lower premiums at the time of issue than our Life Paid up to 100 whole life plan. The Graded Premium Whole Life premium increases in policy year 6, again in policy year 11, 16 and 21. However, no increase will go into effect if the attained age of the Insured is 76 or greater. Issue ages for the Graded Whole Life Plan is ages 0-70. This Plan accumulates dividends and cash values, have riders and supplemental benefits similar to the Life Paid to 100.

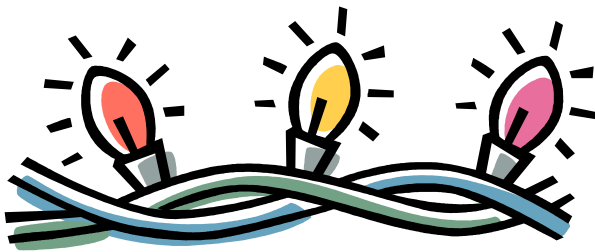
